
- A PERSON WAS INJURED IN A CRASH EVERY 20.8 MINUTES
- A PERSON DIED IN A CRASH EVERY 27.5 HOURS.












AFTER PEAKING IN 2021, TRAFFIC DEATHS PER VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED DECREASED IN 2022.





DRIVER CONTRIBUTING CIRCUMSTANCES -ALL CRASHES-

- 1. Failed to Yield Right-of-Way (20%)
- 2. Followed too Closely (19%)
- 3. Speeding (14%)
- 4. Failed to Keep in Proper Lane (13%)

5. Unsafe Lane Change (8%)

DRIVER CONTRIBUTING CIRCUMSTANCES -FATAL CRASHES-

- 1. Speeding (35%)
- 2. Failed to Keep in Proper Lane (31%)






Teenage drivers account for 23% of total crashes, which is higher than any other age group.


