Driver License Eligibility & Reinstatement

To be eligible to reinstate the license with the 24/7 Sobriety Program, the driver:

- Must be convicted of a DUI or Metabolite Arrest.
- Must be ordered by the court into the 24/7 program or approved sobriety program.
- May not have any suspensions, denials, or revocations that cannot be cleared immediately.
- Must be 21 years or older.
- Can not have more than one refusal arrest.
- Must have served 90 days of revocation time for a refusal.

NOTE: CDL drivers may qualify if they downgrade to a Class D license. A skeleton record may be approved, but the individual will need to apply for a license.

Once eligibility has been established, a judge can court order a person into the 24/7 program as part of their sentencing and may be in addition to other court-ordered treatment programs.
